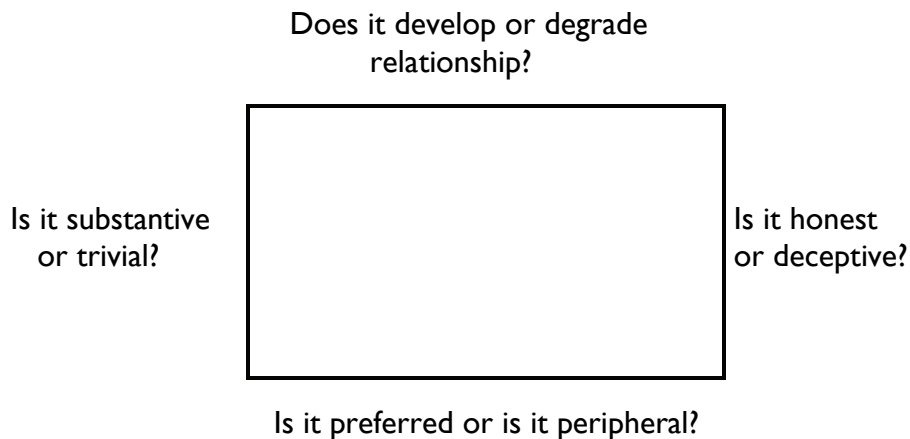
1. Exercise Godly wisdom (5)
