"Regs" for the Kingdom Luke 18:15-30

1. The kingdom of God is available to anyone (15-16)

- a. Jesus showed his love for the lowly
- b. Jesus was <u>angered</u> by the disciple's restriction

2. The kingdom must be entered with <u>humility</u> (17)

3. No one will get in on their own merits (18-23)

- a. The young man had a list of <u>credentials</u>
- b. He may even have believed that Jesus is God
- c. His trust in his own credentials left him lost

4. The only way to be saved is through faith in Jesus

- 2. How is it that a child is closer to the kingdom of God than a fine upstanding pious individual?
