²⁷ "I tell you the truth, some who are standing here will not taste death before they see the kingdom of God."

What does Jesus mean by this?

- 1. Jesus could be referring to the **end times**
- 2. Jesus could be referring to the **Church age**
- *3. Jesus could be referring to the **Transfiguration**

1. The transfiguration was a <u>sample</u> of the kingdom of God (28-33)

- a. They saw the future glory of Christ
- b. They saw <u>representatives</u> of the past and the future
- c. Peter was excited but confused

2. The transfiguration of Jesus <u>encouraged</u> the disciple's faith (34-36)

- a. Jesus provided evidence for their faith
- b. Jesus provided <u>assurance</u> for the future

3. The disciples needed the encouragement (37-45)

- a. They would be <u>challenged</u> in ministry
- b. They would be <u>disappointed</u> by Jesus' death

The Transfiguration reminds us that the best is yet to come!
