1. Jesus was betrayed by a friend (47-53)

- a. A sign of affection was used for defection
- b. He was arrested in spite of healing

2. Jesus was denied by a brother (54-62)

a. Jesus' chief follower trailed way behind

b. Peter's big faith gave way to fear

c. Peter promised to lay down his $\underline{\text{life}}$, and instead lied about $\underline{\text{faith}}$

3. Jesus was mocked by his own creation (63-65)

a. Mankind was made to <u>magnify</u> God, instead they are <u>mocking</u> him

4. Jesus was condemned by the guilty (66-23:25)

a. Jesus was $\underline{acquitted}$ in trial, but $\underline{condemned}$ by an angry crowd
