

## Small Group Questions:

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### *When Rottweilers Attack!* Isaiah 41:1-16, 20

1. What does it look like to “trust God” in the following situations:
  - Unexpected unemployment
  - A single Christian looking for a spouse
  - A diagnosis of a terminal disease
  - Being taken to court on a false charge
2. In contrast, what might it look like to not trust God in each of those situations?
3. Does trusting God mean that you do nothing? What passages of Scripture can you think of to defend your answer?
4. Do you find it easy to trust God? Why or why not?
5. Where else in Scripture can you think of Gods promises to be with His people?
6. Where else in Scripture can you think of that God tells someone not to be afraid?
7. What problems are you facing today?

I. Only God is strong enough to handle our big problems (1-7)

II. God cares enough to handle our big problems (8-14)

III. God can redeem our hardest problems for our good, for the good of others and for His glory. (15-16, 20)
